Woman claims trial to making false claims to finance Hari Raya party

KUALA LUMPUR: A chief admin-istrative assistant of a ministry was yesterday charged with three counts of making RM11,350 in false claims to cover Hari Raya Aidilfitri celebration expenses at her home seven years ago. Noradlina Idris, 43, who used to

work for the Tourism and Culture Ministry (now known as the Tourism, Arts and Culture Min-istry), claimed trial to all the charges before Sessions Court

charges before Sessions Court judge Suzana Hussin. According to the charge sheet, the accused, as an agent of the government of Malaysia, had in-tentionally deceived her princi-pal with documents containing false details. The false documents she pur-portedly furnished were the gov-ernment's orders, which were at-

ernment's orders, which were aternment's orders, which were at-tached with invoices under the name of catering company L'amo Jaya Sdn Bhd for RM850, RM1,500 and RM9,000 dated Aug 13, Aug 14 and Aug 18, 2014, re-spectively. Instead of the invoices issued for the payments of lunch and hi-tea supplies for the minister's

for the payments of lunch and hi-tea supplies for the minister's meetings with guests in August 2014 at the Sultan Abdul Samad building, the payments were ac-tually made for catering services for a Hari Raya Aidilfitri celebra-tion at the accused's house in Taman Impian Putra in Bandar Seri Putra, Bangi, on Aug 16, 2014. 2014.

Noradlina, who was transferred to another ministry after the in-cident, allegedly committed the offence at the Tourism and Culture Ministry office in Putra-

jaya in August 2014. She was charged under Section 18 of the Malaysian Anti-Corrup-tion Commission (MACC) Act 2009, punishable under Section 24 (2) of the Act, which carries a maximum jail term of 20 years and a fine of five times the value of the offence committed or of the offence committed, or

RM10,000, whichever is higher, if convicted. MACC prosecuting officer Abd

Muntaqim Abdul Aziz proposed bail of RM12,000 for all the charges with additional condi-tions that the accused surrender her passport to the court, report to the MACC office once a month,

as well as to not intimidate wit-nesses in the case. The accused, who is a mother of

The accused, who is a monter of four, pleaded for a lower bail. She said she was now working as a chief administrative assis-tant but at a different ministry. The court then allowed No-radlina RM10,000 bail with one

surety and ordered her to sur-render her passport to the court, report to the MACC office in the first week of each month and to not intimidate the witnesses un-til the case is disposed of. Her case will be up for mention

on June 4. Noradlina posted the bail.
