THE Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) today launches an election operations room for the public to channel information and complaints regarding corruption and abuse of power during the N23 Chini by-election.

The election operations room which will be stationed at two locations, respectively one at Kompleks SPRM Pahang Peti Surat 6000, Bandar Indera Mahkota, 25200 Kuantan that will operate during office hours and another one at the Village Security Development Committee Office of Felda Chini Satu, 26690 Pekan which will operate 24 hours.

Suruhanjaya ini dahulunya dikenali sebagai Badan Pencegah Rasuah (BPR).
